
## James 5:19,20

“Now I beseech you, brethren, mark them which cause divisions and offences contrary to the doctrine which ye have learned; and avoid them.”




## II Thessalonians 3:6

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
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- That sin shouldn't be punished




## Matthew 15:7,8




## John 3:16
