
Understanding VS Figurative Literal Language

"A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold In settings of silver."





- What is literal and figurative language?
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#### John 15:1-8(NKJV)

"You are already clean because of the word which I have spoken to you. "Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me. "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing. "If anyone does not abide in Me, he is cast out as a branch and is withered; and they gather them and throw them into the fire, and they are burned. "If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you. "By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples."



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  - Metaphor-compares two concepts without connecting words
  - <u>Personification</u>-projects human qualities to non-human subjects

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  - <u>Hyperbole</u>-extreme exaggeration for emphasis

#### John 12:19(NKJV)


"The Pharisees therefore said among themselves, "You see that you are accomplishing nothing. Look, the world has gone after Him!""

#### Genesis 3:19(NKJV)


"In the sweat of your face you shall eat bread Till you return to the ground, For out of it you were taken; For dust you are, And to dust you shall return."

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  - Synecdoche-exchanging whole for a part or vice versa
  - Metonymy-using one thing to represent another thing with which it is associated

#### Matthew 11:21(NKJV)

# Revelation 1:12(NKJV)


"Then I turned to see the voice that spoke with me. And having turned I saw seven golden lampstands,"




#### I Corinthians 11:25-27(NKJV)



# Rules for determining which type of language is used:

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#### John 2:19-21(NKJV)

"Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." Then the Jews said, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and will You raise it up in three days?" But He was speaking of the temple of His body."




#### Matthew 16:6-12(NKJV)

"Then Jesus said to them, "Take heed and beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and the Sadducees." And they reasoned among themselves, saying, "It is because we have taken no bread." But Jesus, being aware of it, said to them, "O you of little faith, why do you reason among yourselves because you have brought no bread? "Do you not yet understand, or remember the five loaves of the five thousand and how many baskets you took up? "Nor the seven loaves of the four thousand and how many large baskets you took up? "How is it you do not understand that I did not speak to you concerning bread? --but to beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and Sadducees." Then they understood that He did not tell them to beware of the leaven of bread, but of the doctrine of the Pharisees and Sadducees."






""And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?""

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### I Corinthians 3:2(NKJV)


"I fed you with milk and not with solid food; for until now you were not able to receive it, and even now you are still not able;"
