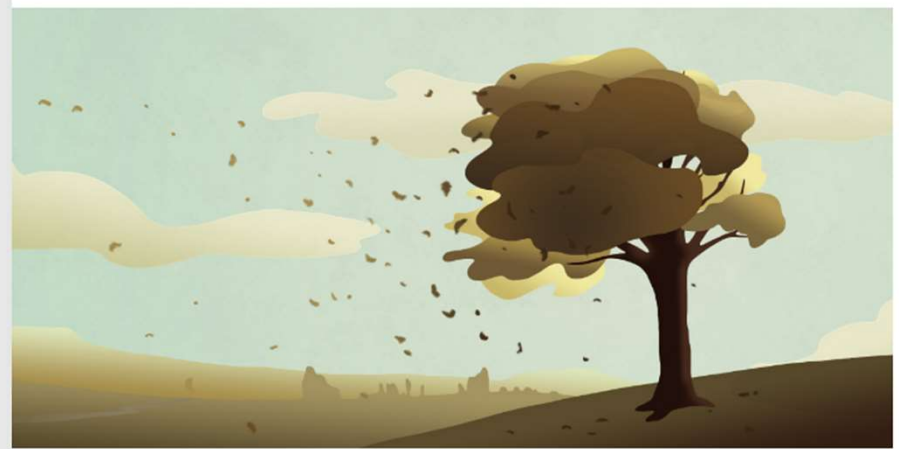

The Bible's answer

The holy spirit is God's power in action, his active force. (Micah 3:8; Luke 1:35) God sends out his spirit by projecting his energy to any place to accomplish his will.—Psalm 104:30; 139:7.

Who is the Holy Spirit?

The Holy Spirit is a Being:

- Not a “force”
- The Holy Spirit is a “He” not an “It”-John 14:16,16; Romans 8:26
- The Holy Spirit:
 - Has a mind-Romans 8:27
 - Has knowledge-I Corinthians 2:11
 - Has a will-I Corinthians 12:8-11
 - Can be grieved-Ephesians 4:30
 - Can be blasphemed-Matthew 12:31,32
 - Can be insulted-Hebrews 10:29
 - Can be lied to-Acts 5:3



Who is the Holy Spirit?

The Holy Spirit is a Being:

- The Holy Spirit is active:
 - The Holy Spirit speaks-I Timothy 4:1; Acts 8:29; Acts 10:19,20; Acts 13:1-4
 - The Holy Spirit teaches-John 14:26
 - The Holy Spirit bears witness-John 15:26, 27
 - The Holy Spirit forbids-Acts 16:6,7
 - The Holy Spirit intercedes-Romans 8:26; Romans 8:34

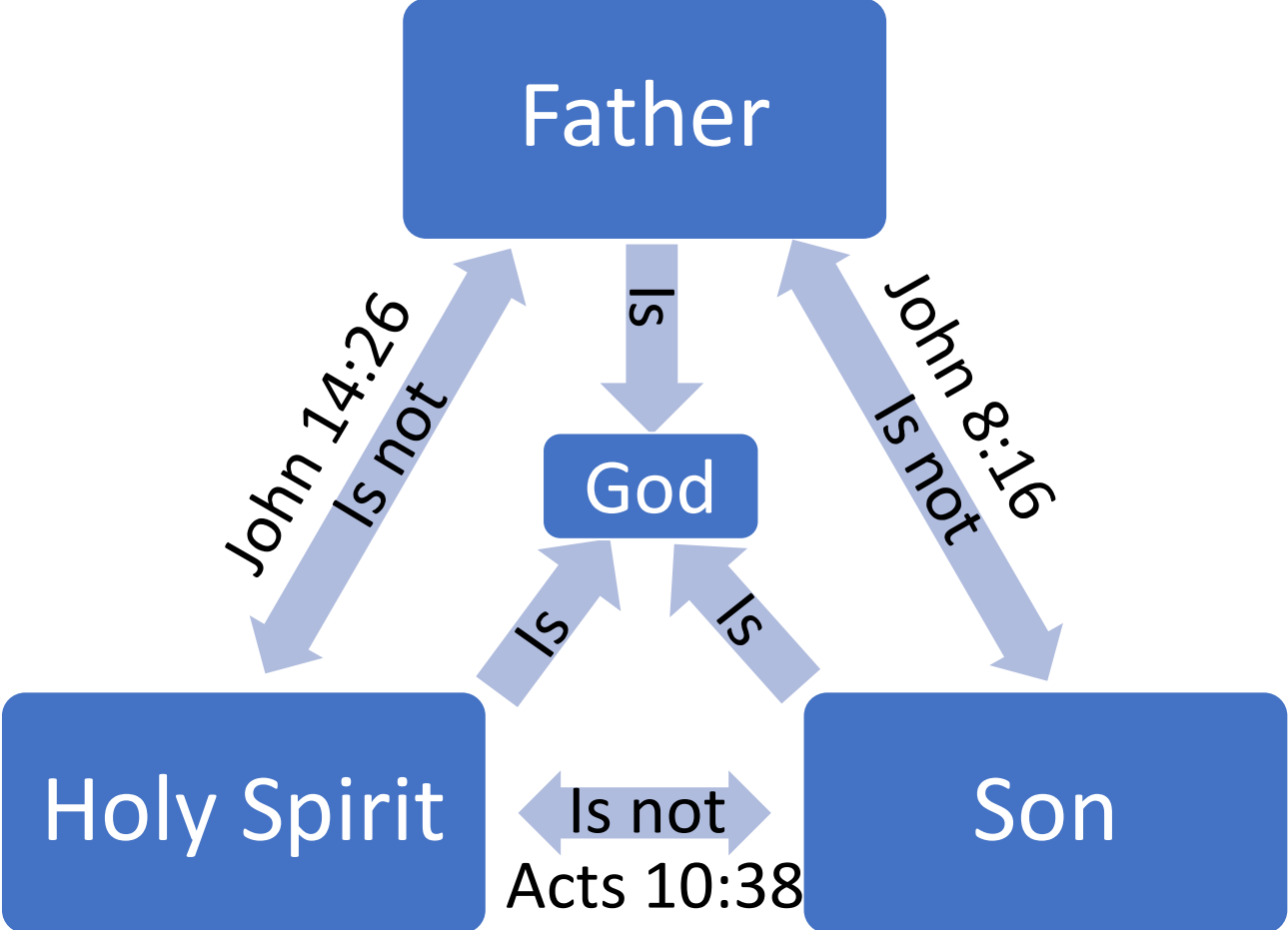


Who is the Holy Spirit?

The Holy Spirit is God:

- The Holy Spirit possesses divine characteristics:
 - The Holy Spirit is omniscient-I Corinthians 2:10,11
 - The Holy Spirit is omnipresent-Psalm 139:7-10
 - The Holy Spirit is eternal-Hebrews 9:14
- The Bible refers to the Holy Spirit as God
 - Acts 5:1-9
- This does not contradict the idea that there is one God-Deuteronomy 6:4; Mark 12:29; Matthew 3:16,17; Matthew 28:19
