What is flattery?

- Webster's Dictionary: "insincere or excessive praise"
- The Cambridge Dictionary: "the act of praising someone, often in a way that is not sincere, because you want something from them"

What Flattery is not

- It is not necessarily flattery to compliment or praise someone
