"What does God have to say to weak people who aren't even very good at repentance? "I desire mercy, not sacrifice." God does not desire to extract from us sacrifices for our sins and promises that we'll do better next time and all the other things we might do to make up for our weakness. God sweeps it all away with this one sweeping statement: "I desire mercy, not sacrifice." That is his deepest heart toward us all."

Hijacked Bible Verses: Matthew 9:13

What this verse can't mean:

- It can't mean that God doesn't want sacrifice (Leviticus 1,3,4,7, etc.)
 What this verse means:
- Knowledge of God demands obedience (Titus 1:16, I John 2:3)
- God wants our heart and our actions (Matthew 22:35-40, John 14:23, John 4:23,24, Isaiah 1:11-17, Proverbs 21:3, Micah 6:6-8, I Samuel 15:22, Mark 12:33, Matthew 5:23,24, Psalm 50, Matthew 23:23)
