


Psallo: how it is translated in the LXX (O.T. Greek)

- It can mean "sing". Jdg 5:3
- It can mean "play". Psa 68:25
- Sometimes its hard to tell. Psa 33:3

Judges 5:3

"Hear, O kings! Give ear, O princes! I, even I, will sing to the Lord; I will sing praise to the Lord God of Israel.



Translations

Two inherent challenges:

1. Word meanings change over time

2. The translated word doesn't always have an exact match

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Hypnos: simply means sleep (Acts 20:9, Romans 13:11) Koimaō: to die (1 Corinthians 15:18) Katheudo: to fall asleep and metaphorically is a reference to yield to sloth and sin, and be indifferent to one's salvation (1)

Thessalonians 5:6)

Psallo - Hebrew Words

there is reference to the instruments in the context (I Samuel 16:16-18, 23; 18: 10; 19:9)

Zamar: make music in praise of God (Psalms 71:22; 98:5; 144:9; 147:7; 149:3)

Ado: to sing (Psalms 13:6; 21:13; 27:6; 18:49; 30:4; 57:7; 59:16ff; 68:4; 68:32; 101:1; 104:33; 138:1; Judges 5:3; Romans 15:9)



Nagan: would refer to instrumental music, but in these cases



Psallo - In the NT

Thayer's, Vines, Strongs, Theological Dictionary of the NT, International Standard Bible Encyclopedia, and nearly every modern English Bible translation - All specify and/or translate the word to be sing

Through His silence, God hasn't given us authority to use instruments in the New Testament

- **DO NOT** presume that we have authority for such in the N.T. **cp. Chron 29:25**
- DO NOT presume God will eternally condemn those who use them.

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BOTTOM LINE: Let us "speak where the Bible speaks and to be silent where it is silent."



- 1. Direct Command
- 2. Approved Example

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Quote: "In the NT we don't ha to do it or don't do it."

Quote: "In the NT we don't have any divine revelation that says

Bible Authority - Straw Man



Quote: "If God is silent, we can not step in to be God. The first time you are presumptuous on either conclusion. Then someone at some point will challenge you, to be consistent. Cause there's going to be many, many things that we can discuss where God has revealed himself that we don't necessarily practice."

Foot washing:

- God has never commanded us to wash other people feet
- This was never an approved example that we must follow in an assembly
- This idea is never presented as an unavoidable conclusion

Was the Bible silent on instrumental music?

8 Verses in the NT connect the Christian to singing (Matthew 26:30, Acts 16:25, Romans 15:9, 1 Cor 14:15, Eph 5:19, Colossians 3:16, Hebrews 2:12, James 5:13)

Matthew 26:30 "And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives."

Act 16:25 "But at midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them."

Romans 15:9 "and that the Gentiles might glorify God for [His] mercy, as it is written: "For this reason I will confess to You among the Gentiles, And sing to Your name."

1 Corinthians 14:15 "What is [the conclusion] then? I will pray with the spirit, and I will also pray with the understanding. I will sing with the spirit, and I will also sing with the understanding."

Ephesians 5:19 "speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord,"

Colossians 3:16 "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord."

Hebrews 2:12 "saying: "I will declare Your name to My brethren; In the midst of the assembly I will sing praise to You."

James 5:13 "Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing psalms."

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Was the Bible silent on instrumental music? Every modern English Bible version and supplemental concordance, bible dictionary, lexicon, etc. translates Psallo as singing in the NT

Was the Bible silent on instrumental music?

Antidotally: Nearly every single denominational leader was adamantly apposed to instrumental singing and it was not allowed in any denomination until well after the leader had passed

Was the Bible silent on instrumental music?

Most importantly: when God tells us what to do, the Bible doesn't have to tell us what not to do.
