A blessed church

1Co.1:1-9

- Spiritual gifts (4-7)
 - Enriched in speech and knowledge (5)
 - > Their works have testified of Christ (6)
 - > Paul was grateful they were not lacking in any gift (7)
 - 1Co.14:26: hymn, lesson, revelation, tongue, interpretation
 - Eager use of their gifts (14:12)
- Blessed with salvation in Christ (8-9)
 - Guiltless before Christ (8)
 - Called by God into fellowship with Christ (9)

A troubled church

1Co.1:10-17

- Paul implores: let there be no divisions (10)
- Chloe's household reports division
 - "I am of Paul ... Apollos ... Cephas ... Christ"
 - > The Corinthians appear susceptible to worldly appeals (17)
- Other issues at Corinth
 - Immoral relationship (5)
 - Public litigation (6)
 - Confusion about marriage issues (7)
 - Indifference toward weaker brethren (8)
 - Association with idolatry (9-10)
 - Misuse of the Lord's Supper (11)
 - Misuse of spiritual gifts (12-14)
 - Confusion about the resurrection (15)

Diagnosing Carnality at Corinth

1Co.1:18-3:4

Paul's outline

- 1:18-25 The gospel must be viewed through the proper lens
- 1:26-31 Humility is required to accept the gospel
- 2:1-5 Establish your faith in God's power, not in men
- 2:6-16 God's wisdom is revealed for the spiritually minded
- 3:1-4 The diagnosis

- (18) Folly to the perishing but the power of God to the saved
- (19-20) The wise & discerning are thwarted by God's power and wisdom
 - A challenge: where are the wise? (Isa.19:11-13)
 cf. Sennacherib & Rabshakeh, Isa.36-37
 - > See also: Gen.41:8; Dn.2:3-11; 5:8-9

- (18) Folly to the perishing but the power of God to the saved
- (19-20) The wise & discerning are thwarted by God's power and wisdom
- (21) God cannot be known by worldly wisdom
 - God's wisdom not discoverable by philosophy, science, man-made religion
 - > True folly, Eph.4:17-20; Isa.44:14-17; Jer.10:1-5; Psa.115:2-8

- (18) Folly to the perishing but the power of God to the saved
- (19-20) The wise & discerning are thwarted by God's power and wisdom
- (21) God cannot be known by worldly wisdom
- (22-24) A crucified Savior: a stumbling block or folly
 - Not the Messiah the Jews expected
 - Jn.1:11; 6:14-15; Ac.1:6; 1Pet.2:8
 - Jn.1:46; 7:40-43, 52; 6:41-42; Lk.4:22
 - > No appeal by worldly standards, Cf. Isa.53:2; 2Ki.5:11-12

- (18) Folly to the perishing but the power of God to the saved
- (19-20) The wise & discerning are thwarted by God's power and wisdom
- (21) God cannot be known by worldly wisdom
- (22-24) A crucified Savior: a stumbling block or folly
- (25) Proper perspective on God's wisdom and power
 - God has no foolishness or weakness
 - Accommodative wording reflects the perspective of a carnal man
 - The world views Christ & His message as foolish
 - A despised, suffering, & dying Savior? >> viewed as weak
 - > What many view as foolish and weak is empowered by Almighty God
 - Jos.6; Jud.6-7; 2Ki.5; Lk.5:4-5; Ac.24:5
 - Isa.55:8-9; 2Co.13:4; 12:8-10

2. Humility is required to accept the gospel

1Co.1:26-31

(26-28) God has chosen the lowly

- > Indication that the Corinthian brethren themselves were not of noble rank
- > By worldly rankings, most nobles reject the gospel
 - The foolish to shame the wise
 - The weak to shame the strong
 - The despised to humble the accomplished
- Evident in the example & teaching of Christ
 Mt.2:23; 5:3; 9:11-13; 18:4; 19:16, 21-22f; Lk.15:2
- > See also: Mt.11:25-26; Jam.2:5; Psa.8:2

2. Humility is required to accept the gospel

1Co.1:26-31

(26-28) God has chosen the lowly

(29-31) Beware of boasting

- > There are no class distinctions, 2Co.11:30; Eph.2:14-22; Jam.2:1-5
- > Self-righteousness and pride, Lk.18:9
- > See also: Jer.9:23-24; 2Co.10:17-18; Gal.6:14

3. Establish your faith in God's power, not in men

- (1) No lofty speech or wisdom
 - Some at Corinth seem to doubt Paul's apostleship & authority in Christ
 - 1Co.9:1-2; 2Co.11:5
 - > They appear to be vulnerable to oratory & humanistic philosophy
 - 2Co.11:6-15; 10:10

3. Establish your faith in God's power, not in men

- (1) No lofty speech or wisdom
- (2) Christ crucified
 - > Death & resurrection the centerpiece of the gospel
 - Focus of most sermons in Acts
 - Christ's victory over death stabilizes our faith Mk.10:42-45; Rev.5:6; Heb.12:1-3;

3. Establish your faith in God's power, not in men

1Co.2:1-5

- (1) No lofty speech or wisdom
- (2) Christ crucified
- (3) Weakness, fear, & trembling
 - > Reflects the tenor of the gospel from 1:18-25
 - > Reflects a sobering & solemn occasion, cf. Ezk.3:16-21; 2Tim.4:2; Jam.3:1
 - > Paul doesn't use a "show of force" to correct misrepresentations about him
 - Ctr. tactics of a carnal ruler, 2Co.10:3-6
 - Shows restraint 2Co.13:10; 11:1,21-29

3. Establish your faith in God's power, not in men 1Co.2:1-5

- (1) No lofty speech or wisdom
- (2) Christ crucified
- (3) Weakness, fear, & trembling
- (4-5) Relied on God's power
 - > Cf. 1:17-18, the gospel IS God's power
 - > See also: Rom.1:16; 2Co.12:9-11

4. God's wisdom is revealed for the spiritually minded 1Co.2:6-16

- (6-8) God's wisdom was not perceivable by rulers
 - > Contrast between heavenly vs. earthly wisdom & power
 - > Lk.11:48-51; Ac.7:52-53

4. God's wisdom is revealed for the spiritually minded 1Co.2:6-16

- (6-8) God's wisdom was not perceivable by rulers
- (9-11) God must reveal His wisdom
 - > Cannot be discerned without His revelation
 - Requires training & practice, Heb.5:14
 - > Spiritual truth cannot originate from human sources
 - Invalid sources abound, e.g.,
 Natural instincts
 Cultural acceptance / majority opinion
 Historical precedent
 Authorities, scholars, or religious leaders
 - Illustration: no one can discern your thoughts unless you reveal them

4. God's wisdom is revealed for the spiritually minded 1Co.2:6-16

- (6-8) God's wisdom was not perceivable by rulers
- (9-11) God must reveal His wisdom
- (12-16) Only a spiritual mindset can understand God's wisdom
 - > The natural mind vs the spiritual mind
 - God's spirit dwells in us through His revealed word
 - Conduct demonstrates the constant influence of Christ
 - Rom.8:5-11; Jer.31:31-34; Heb.10:15-17; Ezk.36:26-27

5. Paul's diagnosis

1Co.3:1-4

The Corinthians are worldly, not spiritually minded

- > They lack a spiritual mindset, not information (ctr. Act.19:2)
- > Worldly mindset manifested in self-ambitions and pride
 - Rivalries are antithetical to spiritual growth 1Co.3:21; 5:2 1Pet.2:1-2; Eph.4:13; 5:...21
 - Don't walk like the Gentiles Rom.8:4-8; Eph.4:17-24; Phi.3:12-21
- > Babes in Christ are not ready for solid food
 - It's time to grow up! Heb.5:11-14

Lessons & observations

- I. The letter begins with reasoning & fundamentals
 - > He does not begin with:
 - A checklist
 - Step 1, Step 2, ... Step 10
 - > They need to refine their way of thinking
 - Carnal behavior could indicate fundamental gaps in understanding
 - Cf. The book of Hebrews
 - >> under a high threat of apostasy, they needed a dense letter on doctrine
 - Many complain that the Bible isn't written as a checklist
 - A list would be impossible long!
 - Consider: Satan's attacks are more subtle than "technical errors"
 - God isn't interested in obedience that's devoid of understanding

II. Beware of carnality & immaturity

- > Look for red flags: e.g.,
 - strife and division, Jam.4:1-4
 - pride, Phi.2:1-4f
 - immorality, Gal.5:19
